Dear Voter,

On Tuesday, March 19, 2024, the General Primary Election will be held to nominate Republican and Democratic candidates for Federal, State and County offices. Political party candidates will be elected, and referenda will appear on the ballot in some areas throughout the County (Village of Grant Park and St. Anne High School District).

By law, voters must request either a Republican or Democratic ballot and receive only one ballot of their choice. A Nonpartisan ballot with just referenda questions will be available in precincts where there are questions on the ballot. As a voter, you may declare affiliation with any party regardless of how you have voted previously.

Congressional, legislative and county board lines changed in 2021 due to redistricting, along with some precinct boundaries. **Your precinct and polling location may have changed. Please refer to your current voter identification card, visit our voter information portal www.kankakeevotes.com, or call our office at 815-937-2990 for polling place information.**

All Kankakee County registered voters may choose to vote by mail, vote early, or cast their ballot at their polling place on Election Day. Please contact our office by phone, email or on our website for more information on voting by mail. Please see page 15 for information on early voting locations and hours.

This Voter Information Guide is intended to provide you with information to assist you in the election process. Please feel free to contact my office if you have any questions. I strongly encourage all citizens to make their voice heard by exercising their right to vote.

“Shall the Village of Grant Park, Kankakee County, Illinois, be authorized to levy a Non-Home Rule Municipal Retailer’s Occupation Tax, Non-Home Rule Municipal Service Occupation Tax, and Non-Home Rule Municipal Use Tax (commonly referred to as “Municipal Sales Taxes”) each at a rate of 1% for expenditures on municipal operations, expenditures on public infrastructure, or property tax relief in accordance with and subject to the provisions of Section 8-11-1.3, 8-11-1.4, and 8-11-1.5 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-11-1.3, 65 ILCS 5/8-11-1.4, and 65 ILCS 5/8-11-1.5)?”

For Voters in St. Anne Grade School District #256 and St. Anne Community High School District #302

Shall an Optional Elementary Unit School District be created in the territory comprising ST. ANNE COMMUNITY CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 256 AND ST. ANNE COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 302, Kankakee County, State of Illinois, with the authority to levy taxes at the rate of: Education fund, K-8, 2.0%, 9-12, 2.0%, combined maximum, 4.0%; operations and maintenance fund, K-8, .375%, 9-12, .375%, combined maximum, .75%; transportation fund, K-8, .125%, 9-12, .125%, combined maximum, .25%; special education fund, K-8, .4%, 9-12, .4%, combined maximum, .8%, each upon all of the taxable property of the district at the value thereof, as equalized or assessed by the Department of Revenue, be established?

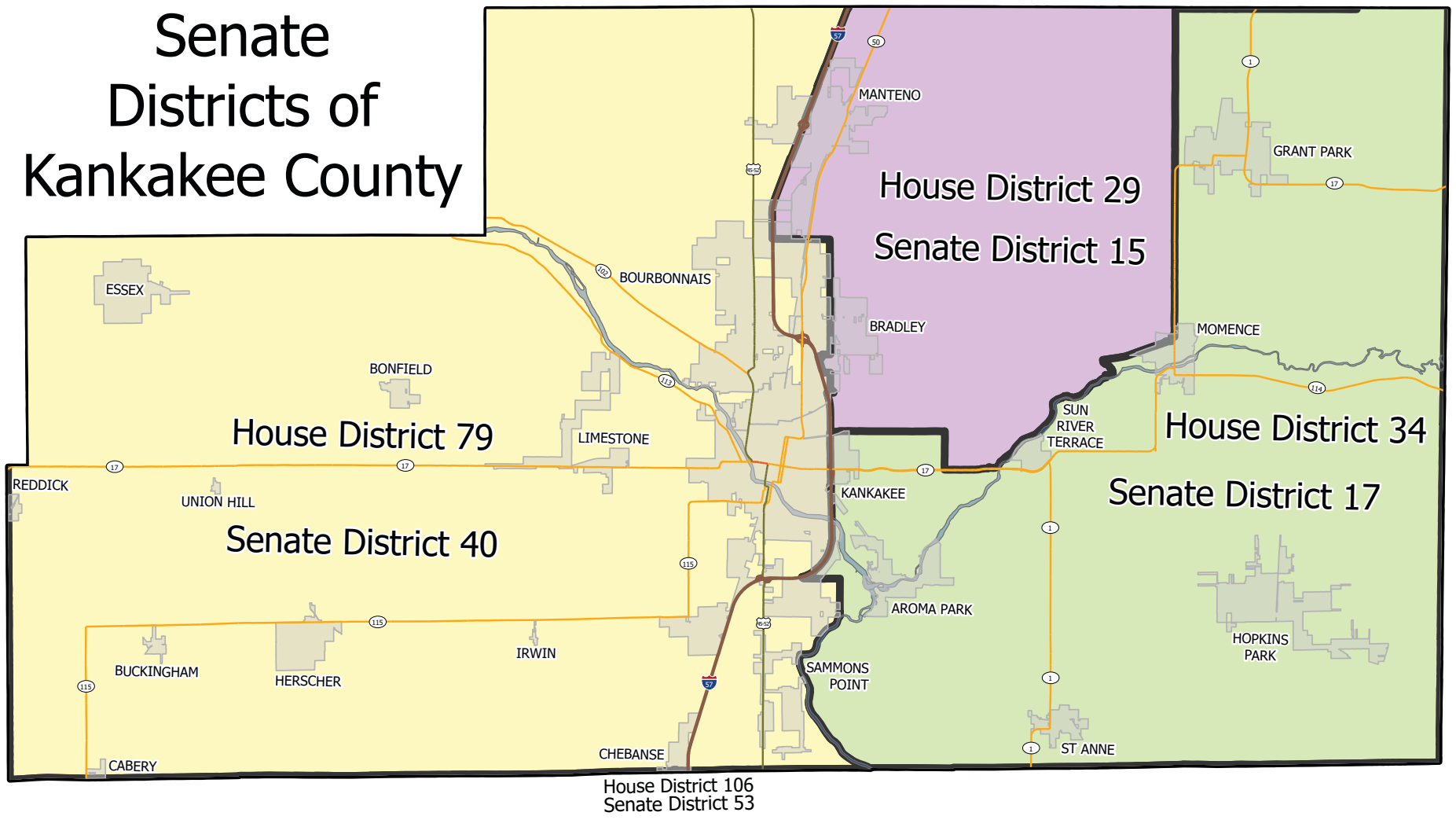


WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU VOTE

- You will be asked your name and address and political party ballot you are requesting
- You must sign the poll pad. That signature is compared to your voter registration signature
- If you registered to vote by mail, you may be required to show current, valid identification
- If you vote early, state law requires that you first provide a current, valid government issued photo ID
- The heading of your ballot should have the same precinct and ballot style number listed on your preprinted application

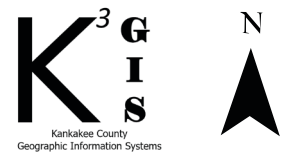
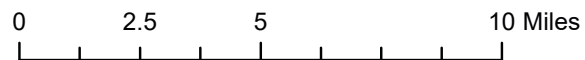
- You can ask for a demonstration on how to mark the ballot
- Use the ballot marking pen issued to you to darken the oval next to the candidate
- Use any available voting booth
- Be sure to read both sides of the ballot
- If you make a mistake, you may spoil the ballot and receive another
- The election judge at the ballot counter is required to check that your ballot is initialed in the upper right hand corner
- You may insert your ballot into the ballot counter without assistance

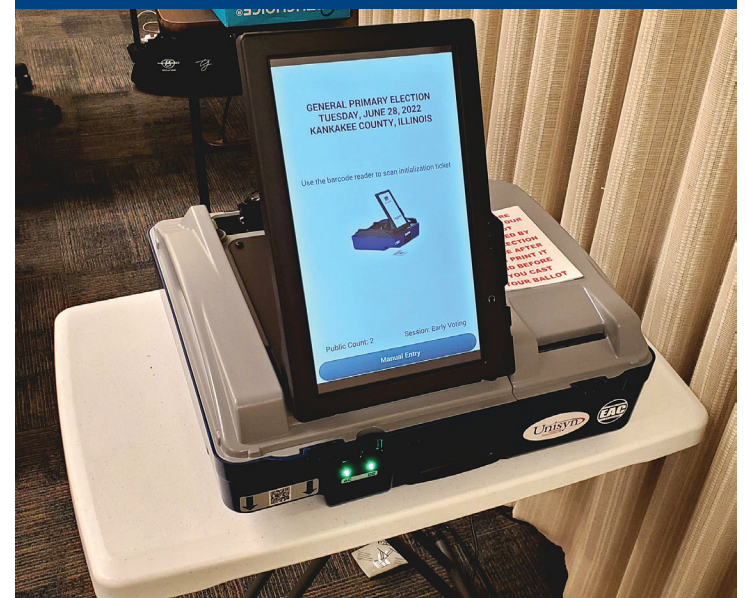
ELECTIONEERING PROHIBITED

Electioneering is: Working for or against a candidate; working in the interest of a party or a public question.

Electioneering is prohibited:

- Inside the room where voting occurs.
- Within 100 feet of the entrance to the room.
- In places of worship requesting no electioneering.

No person shall interrupt, hinder or oppose any voter within 100 feet of the room for voting.



Need to register to vote or update your registration after moving or changing your name?

Grace Period Registration is available now through Election Day, at the Kankakee County Clerk's office. You will be required to vote at the time you update your registration.

To register to vote, you must be:

1. A U.S. Citizen.
2. At least 18 years of age by Election Day.
3. A resident of your precinct at least 30 days prior to Election Day.

In order to register, you must provide two forms of identification, one of which must include your current address. Acceptable forms of identification include:

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

In a primary, why must I declare my political party?

The primary election system is established by Illinois law. Voters must request a Republican or Democratic ballot.

Must I be registered in order to vote?

Yes. Voters must be registered to vote at the address where they live in order to cast a ballot. If you have moved prior to Election Day within Kankakee County and failed to update your registration, you may register and vote at the County Clerk's office or your new polling place. You need to provide two forms of identification, one showing your current address.

How can I check to see if I am registered to vote?

If you visit our website, www.kankakeecountyclerk.gov/election-information and click on "Am I Registered to Vote?" link, you will be able to check your voter registration status, and the location of your polling place.

What is grace period registration?

If you did not register to vote, or transfer your registration before the close of registration (February 20, 2024), you may register to vote at the County Clerk's office from February 21st through March 19th. You will be required to vote in the County Clerk's office at the time of registration. Two forms of identification are required, one must contain your current address.

What is early voting?

Early voting was established in 2006 to allow voters to cast a ballot prior to Election Day without needing a reason (i.e. expecting to be absent from the county). Early Voting takes place at the County Clerk's office through March 18th.

I have family in the military. How can they receive a ballot?

Our website, www.kankakeecountyclerk.gov, has a link on the elections page for military personnel and persons living overseas to print out an FPCA card. This will serve as their absentee ballot application and registration. FPCA cards are also available to military personnel through their commanding officer.

May I vote by mail before Election Day?

Mail-in applications for a ballot must be received by our office no later than March 14th.

Is ID required in order to vote?

Persons who registered to vote by mail and failed to provide our office with identification will be required to present the election judges with valid identification prior to being issued a ballot. Other voters are not required to provide identification, but having your voter ID card or photo identification available could help speed up the voting process.



Some polling places in Kankakee County have been changed and some have been renumbered. Here's how to check where you go to vote:

1. Look at your most recently issued Voter ID card.
2. Check our website www.kankakeecountyclerk.gov/election-information
3. Stop by our office at 189 E. Court St., Kankakee or call 815-937-2990.

MOVE ACT

The Military and Overseas Voter Empowerment Act was enacted in October 2009. The goal of the MOVE Act is to allow easier ballot access to the men and women in uniform by providing new tools which allow more time to participate in the electoral process.

The Federal Voting Assistance Program also helps uniformed service members and their families in the voting process, but includes U.S. citizens living outside the U.S. as well. Both programs help to assist voters in the electoral process.
