Proposed Changes to Chapter 109

Chapter 109 - FLOODS AND STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

ARTICLE III. - STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

DIVISION 10. - VARIANCES AND APPEALS

Sec. 109-320. - Application for variance and appeals; public hearing.

- (a) The county, after a public hearing, may:
 - (1) Determine and vary the requirements and regulations of this article in harmony with their general purpose and intent, where the appropriate entity makes written findings of fact in accordance with the standards herein after prescribed and further, find that there are practical difficulties or particular hardships in the way of carrying out the strict letter of requirements and regulations of this article; and
 - (2) Uphold, modify or overrule the decision of the planning director or his designee.
- (b) A written application for a variance from the requirements of this article or an appeal of a decision by the a county official shall be filed within 30 days of the time when a reasonably prudent person should have become aware of the need or when owner, contractor, lessee, or operator was first made aware of the need for the variance or the decision of the appropriate official. The application shall fully state the grounds of the request and the facts relied upon by the applicant. Said application for a variance shall be verified by a state licensed engineer. Each application shall be filed with the planning director or his designee or the planning department. The planning director or his designee will review and transmit recommendations to the appropriate entity, which shall review such recommendations prior to granting or denying the variance.
- (c) Minutes of the hearing process shall be recorded and written findings shall be made on each of the criteria and made public for all variance decisions, and shall be filed with the county clerk. The costs of the hearing shall be borne by the applicant.
- (d) An application fee as set forth in Chapter 18 shall accompany all applications for variance or appeals.

DIVISION 11. - CONSTRUCTION SITE RUNOFF CONTROL

Subdivision II. - Grading and Drainage Permit Requirements

Sec. 109-382. Class 1 grading and drainage permit application forms.

A completed application form for class 1 grading and drainage permit shall include:

- (1) Name, address and telephone number of the owner and developer of the site, the contractor and of any consulting firm retained by the applicant identifying the principal contractor.
- (2) Certification that all construction covered by the grading and drainage permit will be undertaken in compliance with subdivision I (General requirements for all construction sites) of this division.

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- (3) A site plan created with the use of a worksheet available from the county soil and water conservation district or other suitable methods acceptable to the appropriate authority showing the amount of impervious area being created and BMPs to be implemented. For class 1 permits, stormwater detention calculations may be required with the site plan.
- (4) An application fee as set forth in Chapter 18.

Sec. 109-383. Class 2 grading and drainage permit.

Any construction that meets one of the following thresholds shall require a Class 2 Grading and Drainage Permit:

- (1) Any construction that will include the addition of an impervious surface area (i.e., streets, roof, patio or parking area or any combination thereof) greater than 10,000 square feet.
- (2) Any land disturbing activity (i.e., clearing, grading, stripping, excavation, fill, or any combination thereof) that will affect an area greater than one acre (43,560 square feet).

(Ord. No. 2006-04-11-78, § 2(art. II(D)), 4-11-2006)

Sec. 109-384. Application form.

A completed application form shall include the following as applicable:

- (1) Name, address and telephone number of the owner and developer of the site, the contractor and of any consulting firm retained by the applicant identifying the principal contractor.
- (2) Certification that any land clearing, construction, or development involving the movement of earth shall be in accordance with the plans approved upon issuance of the permit.
- (3) An application fee as set forth in Chapter 18.
- (4) A faithful performance bond or bonds, letter of credit, or other improvement security satisfactory to the state's attorney in an amount deemed sufficient by the planning director or his designee to cover all costs of improvements, landscaping, maintenance of improvements and landscaping, and soil erosion and sediment control measures for such period as specified by the jurisdiction and engineering and inspection costs to cover the cost of failure or repair of improvements installed on the site on a form acceptable to the county (See sample in appendix a). Upon satisfactory completion of the improvements, the documented security would be void.
- (5) The following information shall be submitted for both existing and proposed property conditions for all applicable developments: a topographic survey of the property at one-foot contours (or one-half foot contours for relatively flat areas where additional detail will be required to review drainage designs) unless otherwise specified or approved by the planning director or his designee to a consistent vertical datum specified by the county; and an existing drainage and proposed drainage plan for the property and 100 feet surrounding the property at a scale of not more than 100 feet to one inch, and including the following (unless otherwise specified by the planning director or his designee):
 - a. Property boundary, dimensions, and approximate acreage.
 - b. Building setback lines.
 - c. All existing and proposed structures and sizes.

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- d. Square feet of existing and proposed impervious surface.
- e. All existing, or proposed easements.
- f. All existing, observed, or proposed water or monitoring well head locations.
- g. All existing, observed, or proposed watermains.
- h. All sanitary or combined sewer lines and septic systems.
- i. The banks and centerline of streams and channels.
- j. Shoreline of lakes, ponds, and detention basins with normal water level elevation.
- k. Location, size and slope of stormwater conduits and drainage swales.
- I. Detention facilities showing inlet and outlet locations and details.
- m. Roads, streets and associated stormwater inlets including finished grades.
- n. Base flood elevation, flood fringe, and regulatory floodway.
- o. A vicinity map showing the relationship of the site to its general surroundings at a scale of not greater than 2,000 feet to one-inch (1:24,000).
- p. Title, scale, north arrow, legend, seal of licensed professional engineer, date, and name of person preparing plans.
- q. Subwatershed boundaries within the property.
- r. Offsite areas draining to property, including entire offsite drainage boundary(ies).
- s. Depressional storage areas, including nonjurisdictional wetlands.
- t. Inventoried farm drains and tiles.
- u. Soil classifications.
- (6) The following certifications and design statements shall be provided:
 - a. Basis of design for the final drainage system components.
 - b. A statement giving any applicable engineering assumptions and calculations.
 - c. Design calculations and other submittals as required by this article, including flow rates and velocities at critical points in the drainage system.
 - d. A statement of certification of all drainage plans, calculations, and supporting data by a professional engineer licensed in the state.
- (7) A depiction of environmental features of the property and immediate vicinity including the following:
 - a. The limits of wetland areas.
 - b. The location of trees greater than eight inches in diameter, taken at 4.5 feet dbh in areas to be disturbed.
 - c. Any designated natural areas or prime farmland so designated by the federal, state, or county government.
 - d. Any proposed environmental mitigation features.
 - e. Location and dimensions of a stream buffer area (if required by local jurisdiction).
 - f. Base flood elevation, flood fringe, and regulatory floodplains.

- g. Observed abandoned mines.
- (8) Any and all local, state or federal maps delineating floodplains, floodways, or 100-year frequency flood elevation shall be annotated to reflect the proposed change.
- (9) Conditional approval by FEMA or other regulatory agencies of the proposed changes in the FIRM map.
- (10) Engineering calculations and data supporting all proposed plans. Hydrologic analysis shall be completed in accordance with division 12, subdivision II (Hydrologic design criteria) of this article. Detention system design shall be completed in accordance with division 12, subdivision III (Detention system design criteria) of this article.
- (11) If the project involves modification of a channel with an upstream watershed exceeding 200 acres, the following information shall be submitted:
 - A discussion of the purpose and need for the proposed work.
 - b. Discussion of the practicability of using alternative locations or methods to accomplish the purpose of the proposed work.
 - c. Analysis of the impacts of the proposed project, considering cumulative effects on flood storage and the physical and biological conditions of the body of water affected.
 - Hydraulic analysis of the channel modifications, including pre- and post-project base flood elevations.
 - e. Additional information as required by this article.
- (12) Stormwater pollution prevention plan (SWP3) prepared in accordance with division 13 of this article. (Ord. No. 2006-04-11-78, § 2(art. II(E)), 4-11-2006)

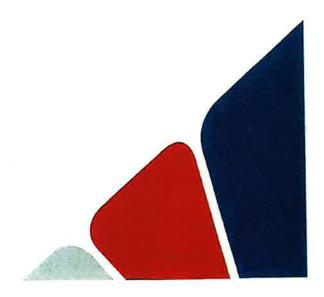

Re: Illini Solar, LLC - Decommissioning and Financial Surety

Introduction

Nexamp has prepared this Decommissioning Plan (Plan) for the Illini Solar, LLC photovoltaic facility (Facility) to be located 3953 W 1000 S Road, Limestone Township, IL 60901. This Plan has been prepared to fulfill the requirements of state and local permitting bylaws and zoning ordinances in accordance with solar development best practices.

Facility Description

The proposed Facility consists of an approximately 3.1 Megawatt (MW) DC (2.0 MW AC) capacity solar power-generating plant secured within an 8' high security fence surrounding the solar panels and equipment and accessed via a locked security fence. The proposed lease area for the Facility is primarily undeveloped farmland accessed by a gravel drive. The Facility will include the following site features:

- An approximately 15.1-acre array of photovoltaic (PV) modules and mounting system;
- Driven piles supporting the photovoltaic modules;
- One transformer (filled with biodegradable vegetable oil);
- An eight (8)-foot fixed knot farm security fence;
- Underground conduit and wires;
- 6 aboveground wooden utility poles;
- Overhead wires;
- A gravel access road; and
- A metal security gate at the access road entrance

Decommissioning Plan

The Facility will be decommissioned by completing the following major steps: 1) Dismantlement and Demolition, Disposal or Recycle; and 2) Site Stabilization, as further described below.

Dismantlement, Demolition, and Disposal or Recycle

A significant portion of the components of the photovoltaic system at the Facility will include recyclable or re-saleable materials, including copper, aluminum, galvanized steel, and modules. Due to their re-sale monetary value, these components will be dismantled and disassembled rather than being demolished and disposed of.

Following coordination with Commonwealth Edison (ComEd) regarding timing and required procedures for disconnecting the Facility from the utility distribution network, all electrical connections to the system will be disconnected and all connections will be tested locally to confirm that no electric current is running through them before proceeding. All electrical connections to the panels will be cut at the panel and then removed from their framework by cutting or dismantling the connections to the

supports. They will then be stacked on pallets and transferred to a flat-bed truck for transfer to the purchaser, recycler, or landfill.

The PV mounting system framework will be dismantled and recycled. The metal piles will be removed from their approximated depth of ten feet and recycled for salvage value.

Finally, all associated structures will be demolished and removed from the site for recycling or disposal. This will include the site fence and gates, which will likely be reclaimed or recycled. Grade slabs will be broken and removed to a depth of one foot below grade, and clean concrete will be crushed and disposed of off-site or recycled (reused either on- or off-site).

Aboveground utility poles owned by Illini Solar, LLC will be completely removed and disposed of off-site in accordance with utility best practices. Overhead wires will be removed from the area of the solar modules and terminated at the utility-owned utility poles. ComEd will be responsible for dismantling those overhead wires and poles under its ownership. Coordination with ComEd personnel will occur to facilitate ComEd's removal of its aboveground poles and overhead wires located on the site.

A final site walkthrough will be conducted to remove debris and/or trash generated within the site during the decommissioning process and will include removal and proper disposal of any debris that may have been wind-blown to areas outside the immediate footprint of the facility being removed.

Site Stabilization

Any areas of the Facility that are disturbed during decommissioning will be stabilized with a ground treatment approved by the Planning Board, including application of a drought-tolerant grass seed mix to disturbed surfaces. The gravel access road, including the portion within the perimeter fence surrounding the photovoltaic modules, will be removed.

Permitting Requirements

Given the size and location of the Facility, several approvals are required prior to initiation of ground-disturbing activity. Table 1 provides a summary of the expected approvals if the decommissioning were to take place in January 2023. Please note, however, that because the decommissioning is expected to occur at a later date, the permitting requirements listed in the table below will be reviewed and updated based on current local, state, and federal regulations at the time.

Schedule and Cost

The decommissioning process is estimated to take approximately six to eight (6-8) weeks depending on seasonality. Decommissioning will be completed outside of the winter season.

Surety Proposal/ Decommissioning Cost Estimate

Consistent with the approach it has taken with many solar projects of a similar size and scope in other Illinois communities, Nexamp, Inc., the parent company of Illini Solar, LLC, proposes to provide a form of decommissioning surety (ie., bond, letter of credit, or cash escrow) to be posted prior to the beginning of solar project operations in the amount of \$276,348. This amount is intended to cover the cost of decommissioning in the unlikely event that Nexamp is unable to meet its contractual obligations for solar project removal and restoration.

In developing the proposed amount of the decommissioning surety, Nexamp utilized a local professional engineering firm, who has collected their estimating data from a variety of sources. Nexamp has not included salvage value in its estimates and has fully accounted for the full value of demolishing and removing all solar array materials.

A summary of the analysis is provided below:

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this $\underline{\mathcal{I}}^{\text{th}}$ day of $\underline{\text{November}}$, 2022, between the VILLAGE OF BOURBONNAIS, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "VILLAGE" and the County of Kankakee, hereinafter referred to as the "County."

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970, Article VII, Section 10, authorizes units of local government to contract or otherwise associate among themselves in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, 5 ILCS 220/1, entitled the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act," provides that any power or powers, privileges or authority exercised or which may be exercised by a unit of local government may be exercised and enjoyed jointly with any other unit of local government; and,

WHEREAS, 5 ILCS 220/2, defines a public agency as follows:

"any unit of local government as defined in the Illinois Constitution of 1970, any school district, any public community college district, any public building commission, the State of Illinois, any agency of the State government or of the United States, or any other State, any political subdivision of another State, and any combination of the above pursuant to an intergovernmental agreement which includes provisions for a governing body of the agency created by the agreement."

WHEREAS, the County is a unit of government situated within the State of Illinois and pursuant to the laws of the State and the County has established the Kankakee County Historic Preservation Commission, which is a certified local government, for the purpose of preserving and protecting historically significant buildings, structures, landmarks and sites within the County; and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE is a unit of government situated within the corporate boundaries of Kankakee County, Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, the County and VILLAGE have agreed that the Kankakee County Historic Preservation Commission can recommend to the VILLAGE Board, landmark designation or action associated with physical structures/landmarks within the Municipal Boundaries of the VILLAGE OF BOURBONNAIS on a case by case basis.

WHEREAS, the Cooperating Parties desire to enter into an intergovernmental agreement in order to preserve the historic, architectural, scenic, and aesthetic character of the <u>Bourbonnais Grove School House</u>, so that it may be recognized as a Kankakee County landmark.

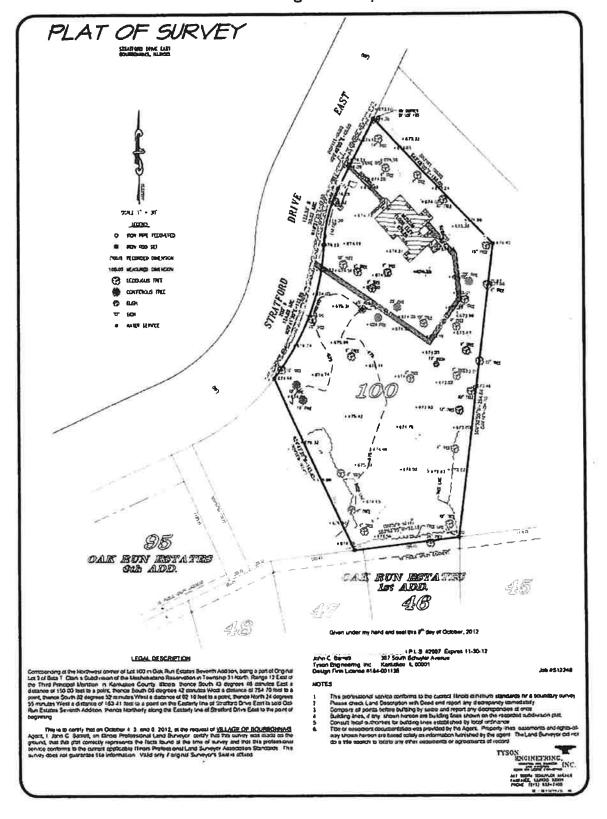
NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the Cooperating Parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. That the <u>Bourbonnais Grove School House</u> is legally described as attached on (name of property)
 - Exhibit A. The common address is: 704 Stratford Dr E, Bourbonnais, IL 60914.
- 2. That the Cooperating Parties feel that said property is a valuable asset to Kankakee County as a local landmark.
- 3. That this agreement shall become operative upon execution by both of the Cooperating Parties.
- 4. That no amendment or modification shall be made to this agreement without the prior written approval of both Cooperating Parties.
- 5. The laws of the State of Illinois shall control the interpretation of this Agreement.
- 6. The provisions of this Agreement are severable. If any paragraph, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Agreement is for any reason held to be contrary to law, or contrary to any rule or regulation having the force and effect of law, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of the Agreement.

Exhibit A – Legal Description



Application for Ordinance Designating Bourbonnais Grove's First Log Schoolhouse as a Village Landmark

A. This structure is identified with persons who significantly contributed to development of the village.

This property is directly related to pioneer settlers Thomas Durham (1784-1854), his wife Margaret Durham (1796-1882), and Noel LeVasseur (1799-1879). In 1837, Thomas Durham was serving his second year as Will County's Rock Village Precinct Commissioner as well as completing the masonry work on Noel LeVasseur's new home. One can imagine that the Durhams, LeVasseur, and other French-Canadian pioneers met at the Durham log home or LeVasseur's trading post to discuss the need for a local school. LeVasseur had just married Ruth (Russell Bull) LeVasseur (1818-60). Durham negotiated with the Will County school system to build the school just ¼ mile north of his farmhouse along the Danville to Chicago Road. The Bourbonnais Grove log school was built in 1837. It was the second log cabin school in the Kankakee River Valley—the first one was built just a year earlier in Aroma Park.

Thomas and Margaret Durham arrived in Bourbonnais Grove in 1835 with nine children (Barbara, Artemacy, Arabella, Harris, Pleasant, Martha, Margaret, Thomas, and Stephen). Their seven children (Arabella to Daniel) would have been of school age between 1837-48. The only two of Noel and Ruth LeVasseur's children who would have been of school age during that time were Edward and Julia. Edward was born in 1838 and would have gone to the school. Julia was born in 1840 and would have attended the school before it closed. The other LeVasseur children were born after the school closed in 1848. Henry F. Tower reported that he attended the Bourbonnais Grove school in 1847 at the age of 11 with two of Noel LeVasseur's children. As you see above, Edward and Julia were the only two children possible—proving the school was coed.

In 1837, Thomas Durham must have supervised the original construction work of volunteer builders Solomon Yoder/Yeader or Joseph Boltonhouse, or both. The log school was a one and ½ story 20-foot by 20-foot structure. Although it remains uncertain when classes began, one can surmise that

classes began shortly after construction was completed, given the large number of children in the young settlement and the value the residents placed on education.

First teacher hired by Will County School District Commissioner Levi Jenks was either Yodor/Yeader or Boltonhouse. After public subscription/tuition, classes began—probably ten children learning reading, writing, math, and geography. French was one of the primary languages spoken. Other teachers were Milton O. Clark (before 1844), Charles Starr (1844-45), and Joseph Jeffcoat (1847-48). Henry Tower who was interviewed by Burt Burroughs in 1929, stated that his teacher, Charles Starr, boarded at the Durham farmhouse.

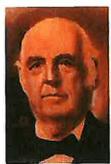
Before the school closed in 1848, it had become a meeting place for the Methodist circuit riders. The first Methodist quarterly meeting was held at the school house in January 1842 (Reverend John Sinclair presiding). Bourbonnais Grove then became part of the six-week Methodist circuit the following year with Reverends Stephen R. Beggs (in 1843), James Leckenby (in 1844), Chapin (in 1845), David Lewis (in 1847), and C. Lazenby (in 1848) offering services to the Kankakee River Valley residents as Methodist preachers. Levi Jenks (1808-87), who was also a Methodist preacher and director of Will County schools in 1837, may have helped organize the Wilmington Circuit (1838)—formerly known as the Forked Creek Circuit (1837) and part of the Joliet Circuit (1836). The Wilmington Circuit embraced all the settlements from Channahon south along the Kankakee River to Momence.



One of the Methodist Circuit riders was Reverend Stephen Beggs (1801-95).

The Former Log Schoolhouse: A French-Canadian Family Home From 1848 to 2010

• In 1848, Bourbonnais Grove village blacksmith Joseph Lesage (1828-1920) purchased the school. Joseph was born in 1828 in St-Leon-le-Grand, Quebec Province. He married Domitilde Boucher in St-Leon-le-Grand in 1848 right before moving to Bourbonnais Grove. Joseph converted the log schoolhouse into a home with his blacksmith shop next door. Two weeks after giving birth to daughter named Domitilde in 1850, mother Domitilde mother died. In 1853, Joseph married Julie Fortier (1831-97). They had ten (10) children in the former schoolhouse: Joseph who became a priest, Elizabeth Martin, Alfred, Marie/Mary Letourneau, Marie Julie who became a nun, Isaac Gaspar, Dr. Philip Isaac, Sophie Eugenie, Marie Josephine, and Dr. Joseph Arthur Thomas Viateur.

On October 11, 1870, Domitilde Lesage (1850-1928), Joseph's oldest daughter, married Canadianborn Charles Henry Byron/Biron (1846-1912). In 1871, Domitilde and Charles were driven from their Chicago home by the Great Fire. Domitilde's father and step mother (Joseph and Julie), invited the Chicago Fire refugee couple to live in the former log schoolhouse. The Byron/Biron family grew to ten children: Marie Josephine, Eugenie, (Sister Mary Melanie), Arthur, Joseph, Juliette Richer, Joseph Hermenegilde, Joseph George "Foxy", Marie Anne Corine (Sister Imelda de Jesus, and Joseph Eugenie. Charles—appointed village postmaster on June 20, 1892—ran the post office and a small grocery store out of the home.

- Marie/Mary Lasage (1859-1934), daughter of Joseph and his second wife Julie, was born in the log schoolhouse. She later married Philippe Letourneau (1860-1932), son of George and Elodie Letourneau.
- By 1920, Alphonse "Mike" Marcotte (1888-1953), a painter, purchased the home. For a couple of years, he lived there with his three brothers: Eli (1885-1930), Philip (1890-1957), Ralph Sr. (1897-1969). Alphonse married the widow Clara (Benoit) Cyrier on September 21, 1922. They lived in the house with Clara's two daughters from her previous marriage, Dorothy and Marguerite. Alphonse and Clara soon had a daughter of their own, Anna Maria (b. July 24, 1923).
- The newlyweds Richard (1926-69) and Mary Ann (Lambert) Rivard (1927-2012) purchased the former schoolhouse in 1946, and did extensive remodeling to accommodate their growing family. They raised 10 children in the schoolhouse.
- The home even served as a gas station for a while in the 1940-60s.

- In 1970, Ralph "Red" Marcotte Jr. (1931-2011) and his wife Mary (1932-2019) purchased the home form Mary Ann (Lambert) Rivard. Red and Mary rented their home from 1971-74 to Sister Theresa Galvin and other nuns of Montreal-based Congregation of Notre Dame. From 1974 to 1997, Red and Mary lived and raised their nine children (Andre, Annette, Denise, Jacques, Joel, Michelle, Phil, Pierre, and Jon) in the home. By 1997, it was just Red, Mary, their oldest daughter Denise, with her daughter Anna, living in the former log schoolhouse. That year, the four family members moved to Kristina Drive. From August 1997 to October 1998, Red and Mary's son Andre and his wife Melissa with their two boys, rented the home. After they moved out, other renters lived in the home until 2010, when it was sold to the Village of Bourbonnais.
- After Red's death, Mary retained ownership until 2010 when the Village of Bourbonnais purchased the Marcotte Home.
- Due to disrepair caused by a fire, the home was demolished in December 2011. The logs of the
 former schoolhouse were surgically removed by historic preservationist Tim Kilby of Defiance,
 Missouri and Piggush-Simoneau Inc. of Bourbonnais. Kilby remarked that about 60% of the
 original structure remained. The logs have been stored inside a Bourbonnais Township facility.
- The original logs were hand-split, rough, square and held together with wooden pegs.

B. The property embodies distinguishing characteristics of a type, period, and method of construction.

In 2011, the French-Canadian home that was built around the log schoolhouse was dismantled (situated at 493 S. Main Street, Bourbonnais). The logs dating back to 1837 were surgically removed by historic preservationist Tim Kilby of Defiance, Missouri and Piggush-Simoneau Inc. of Bourbonnais. Kilby remarked that about 60% of the schoolhouse's original structure remained, and that the logs—with dovetail notching—were in good condition. Each of the logs was numbered with easy to read metal tags, diagramed, and blueprinted. The original logs were hand-split, rough, and square. The logs are stored inside a Bourbonnais Township facility. The 40% missing logs have been acquired by PSI Inc. and are currently being kiln dried for 60 days. Once drying is complete, the logs will be integrated with the original logs. One original log was termite damaged. The good parts of that log will be used for window or door frames.



As the house at 493 S. Main Street, Bourbonnais, was dismantled in 2011, the 1837 log schoolhouse structure was revealed (first three photographs from left). The logs were labeled and then stored in a Bourbonnais Township Public Works facility (at right).

Even though the restored log schoolhouse will be climate controlled (to protect the inside artifacts and allow a comfortable environment for educational tours), the structure will look like it did in 1837, with chinking between the log.

C: Informational Potential

The restored log schoolhouse will be a permanent exhibit of the Bourbonnais Grove Historical Society. The Village of Bourbonnais will own the structure, but the BGHS will maintain it and open it to the public. Educational tours will teach what a school day was like in the 1830s and 1840s. Individuals will be able to compare and contrast their school experience with that of the Bourbonnais Grove Log Schoolhouse. They will notice the similarities and differences in the building, furnishings, teacher, and curriculum.



The above photographs (from left to right) represent some of the items that will be in the log schoolhouse: the students' table and bench, teacher's desk, and 1807 General View of the World. The girl at right is in period clothing.

Site tours and open houses offered by the BGHS will also explain highlights of the French-Canadian families who lived continuously in the "home" when it was no longer a schoolhouse from 1848-2020.

D. Additional reasons why Bourbonnais Grove's first log schoolhouse should be designated as a Village of Bourbonnais historic landmark.

- The property has retained its integrity in design, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association with the past.
- Log structure—once common throughout the United States, original log structures are quickly vanishing. Every axe cut and adze mark in a hand-hewn log structure tells the story of our pioneer heritage and the spirit of self-reliance that forged the nation.
- Only one-room log schoolhouse in Kankakee County—the logs date back to 1837 when they were harvested from hardwoods in the Bourbonnais Grove settlement. When one touches these logs, one will indeed literally touch our local history's inception in the aftermath of the Potawatomi removal.
- Community support--in 2017, the BGHS and Village of Bourbonnais earnestly began fund raising for the log schoolhouse restoration with the First Annual Fleur-de-Lis

Celebration Dinner at the Kankakee Country Club. The restoration would be on the Adrien M. Richard Heritage Preserve, northwest of the Letourneau Home/Museum at 698 Stratford Drive East in Bourbonnais.

- On June 1, 2017, the Bourbonnais Grove Historical Society's membership approved the first Fleur-de-Lis Celebration Dinner for November 3, 2017, to raise funds for the restoration and publicize its presence in the community.
- A BGHS and Village of Bourbonnais Log Schoolhouse Steering Committee was formed on April 4, 2018 to continue the fundraising efforts for restoring the log schoolhouse.
- On January 20, 2022, this committee was renamed the BGHS Log Schoolhouse Advisory Committee—to oversee the log schoolhouse as a permanent exhibit of the Bourbonnais Grove Historical Society.
- A major boost to the fundraising campaign came on August 2, 2019 when the BGHS
 membership approved for the log schoolhouse restoration \$18,224.72 from a bequest of
 Frances Cooper Wertz (1915-2018) to the historical society.
- There have been five annual fund raising campaigns culminating with the fall Fleur-de-Lis Celebration Dinners (there was no celebration dinner in 2020). Over \$64,000 has been raised for the restoration. A list of donors—confirming community support follows this narrative.

The reassembly of the log schoolhouse is currently taking place at a Piggush-Simoneau Inc construction building. The additional vintage logs that have been found are being kiln dried for 60 days. The reassembly is being done in a protected environment to figure out the best fit of the logs and calculate/measure where the additional logs are needed. After the supplemental logs (about 40% of the total logs) arrive, construction will resume (next to the Letourneau Home/Museum) on the Adrien M. Richard Heritage Preserve at 698 Stratford Drive East, Bourbonnais. The inauguration/dedication of the log schoolhouse is scheduled for Tuesday afternoon November 15.

Kankakee County Highway Department Road Use Agreement

This Road Use Agreement (AGREEMENT) is made and entered into this _____ day of ______, 2023 by and between the County of Kankakee, Illinois, a body corporate and politic under the Laws of the State of Illinois (COUNTY), and Peterman Solar, LLC (COMPANY). The COUNTY and COMPANY are sometimes referred to herein individually as a PARTY and collectively as the PARTIES. The term Representative(s) shall include COMPANY 's contractors, subcontractors, employees, material suppliers, vendors, transport providers, representatives, and designees.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, COMPANY intends to construct a two (2.0) megawatt Sun Powered Energy Generation Station and other ancillary facilities (PROJECT) in the County of Kankakee on CH 22 at 3914 E 3500S Rd, Aroma Township, IL; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the construction of the PROJECT, the COUNTY desires to address certain issues relating to the roads owned and operated and maintained by the COUNTY (collectively, the County Highways) over which it will be necessary for COMPANY and COMPANY's Representative(s) to, among other things, (I) transport heavy equipment and materials over certain County Highways, which may in certain cases be in excess of the design limits of the County Highways; (II) transport certain locally sourced materials, such as concrete and aggregates, on those designated County Highways, (III) transport labor, and (IV) place utilities adjacent to, or under certain County Highways, and

WHEREAS, under 605 ILCS 5/5 et seq. the COUNTY has broad power regarding the opening, construction, maintenance, relocation, access to, or repair of highways in the County Highway system, and

WHEREAS 605 ILCS 5/9-113 grants to the COUNTY, authority to impose reasonable rules, regulations, and specifications for the use of County Highways by public and private utilities; and

WHEREAS 605 ILCS 5/9-113.01 imposes a liability on public or private utilities for any damage to County Highways; and

WHEREAS, 605 ILCS 5/9-122 imposes a liability on damage done to a bridge or culvert; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare that COMPANY and the COUNTY reach an agreement to address the majority of issues that will arise in a project of this seize; and

WHEREAS COMPANY has provided to the County Engineer of Kankakee County, Illinois (COUNTY ENGINEER) a construction plan for the Project that shows the haul routes, road crossings, access points, and construction access roads, a copy of which is attached as the Principal Road Use Schedule (EXHIBIT A); and

WHEREAS, COMPANY and the COUNTY wish to set forth their understanding and agreement as to the road issues relating to the construction and operation of the PROJECT; and

WHEREAS; this AGREEMENT shall apply to those County Highways outlined on the Plan and are included and/or otherwise referenced in EXHIBIT A.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein set forth, the PARTIES, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

SECTION 1 COMPANY agrees to undertake the following actions in accordance with the terms of this Agreement

A. Provide contact information for the COMPANY Construction Manager and Project Engineer, who will be stationed no farther that two (2) hours away from the COUNTY, and the COMPANY Permit Agent.

- B. Provide as much advance notice as is reasonable to the COUNTY ENGINEER's office in advance of all oversize and overweight vehicle moves and equipment for all routes for individual review and permitting.
- C. Transport oversize loads so as to minimize adverse impact on the local traffic.
- D. Provide as much advance notice as is commercially reasonable to obtain approval of the COUNTY when it is necessary for a road to be closed for any reason. Notwithstanding, the generality of the aforementioned, COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) will provide 48 hours' notice to the extent reasonably practicable
- E. Sign all highway work zones and closures in accordance with the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices and the Illinois Department of Transportation Supplement to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices in accordance with Chapter 430 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes and current Illinois Department of Transportation Traffic Control Standards.
- F. Keep all County Highways used by COMPANY or COMPANY Representative(s) clear, by removing all mud, dirt, dust, spilled or tracked material, garbage, obstruction, or other hazards, caused by COMPANY upon notice and within a reasonable time period.
- G. Prohibit the use of County Highway right of way as storage or staging areas and as parking areas for vehicles and equipment of all contractors, sub-contractors, employees, material suppliers, vendors, transport providers, representatives and designees.
- H. Pay for the cost of all repairs to all County Highways that are damaged by COMPANY Representative(s) during the construction of the PROJECT and restore such roads to the condition they were prior to the PROJECT's construction.
- I. Take such measures as are reasonably required during an extended work suspension to provide for safe vehicular travel on County Highways damaged as a direct result of COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) use as directed by the COUNTY. The extended work suspension may be caused by but not limited to seasonal weather conditions, "acts of God", or labor disagreements.
- J. Acknowledge that any estimates for road repairs or restorations are good faith estimates provided by the COUNTY or a consultant (who

must be mutually approved by both PARTIES, but the final actual costs may vary.

- K. Provide a single Surety Bond in accordance with Section 6 of this AGREEMENT for the purposes of road repair or restoration
- L. Anywhere in this AGREEMENT, with the exception of any payments directed in or by Sections 5, 6, or 7 herein, that obligates COMPANY to make a payment, said payment shall be made directly to the County Highway Department within 21 days of receipt of a reasonable invoice, containing such detail as COMPANY may reasonably request, from the County Highway Department. Such payments shall be made, at COMPANY's discretion, by check or wire transfer of immediately available funds.

<u>Section 2</u>. The COUNTY, in accordance with the terms of this AGREEMENT, agrees to:

- A. Consent to the use of the County Highway's rights-of-way for utility encroachments for the PROJECT by separate permit. Consent granted herein shall be effective only to the extent of the property interest of the COUNTY. Such consent shall not be binding on any owner of a fee over or under which the highway is located and shall not relieve COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) from obtaining by purchase, condemnation, or otherwise the necessary approval of any owner of the fee over or under which the highway is located if such approval is legally required.
- B. Review for approval all oversize or overweight equipment using the County Highways by giving consideration of road damage and traffic safety in a reasonable manner based on accepted engineering practices and issue individual permits for those loads.
- C. Issue individual vehicle overweight and oversize permits for County Highways in a timely manner for the roads scheduled on EXHIBIT A upon the filing of such applications on behalf of COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) and concurrent with any applicable Illinois Department of Transportation OS/OW Permit(s).
- D. Coordinate with COMPANY and COMPANY's Representative(s) so as to minimize the impact of their use of the County Highway system.
- E. Perform all routine maintenance on the County Highways used for the PROJECT in accordance with Section 5 of this AGREEMENT.

- F. Review in a timely manner for approval all access points to the County Highway system by considering sight distances, drainage and proximity to other entrances, in a reasonable manner, and in accordance with accepted engineering practices and issue access permits.
- G. Prepare estimates in good faith based on the design of all road repairs or restorations in accordance with IDOT Bureau of Local Roads and Street Manual.
- H. Authorize the County Engineer to agree on behalf of the County to revisions to EXHIBIT A and to determine appropriate improvements.

Section 3. Road Inventory

- A. Pre-Construction Inspection: COMPANY or COMPANY's representatives, prior to commencement of construction, shall jointly prepare with COUNTY staff a video recording inspection of the condition of the pavement surface of the Routes specified in EXHIBIT A. That work shall be coordinated with the COUNTY. During the video survey, the entire length of the roads as listed in EXHIBIT A shall be videotaped
- B. Post-Construction Inspection: Upon completion of the PROJECT, COMPANY shall contact the COUNTY and arrange for a timely (within 7 days) a post-construction inspection. Any damage discovered that can be reasonably attributed to the PROJECT shall be repaired to the satisfaction of the COUNTY by COMPANY.
- C. Incidental/Accidental Use: The PARTIES recognize that the PROJECT traffic may, either through mistake or with the consent of the COUNTY, use roads or access points other than those listed on EXHIBIT A. Repairs for damage caused by COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) during such mistaken or permitted use shall be paid for or repaired as provided in Sections 5 and 6 of this AGREEMENT, as applicable.

Section 4. Construction Cooperation:

A. Prior to the commencement of PORJECT construction COMPANY shall provide the COUNTY with 48 hours' notice prior to beginning any work.

Section 5. Maintenance of the County Highways

A. The daily routine maintenance of the County Highways being utilized by the PROJECT including snow removal, striping and routine signage and regularly scheduled maintenance or repair shall be the responsibility of the COUNTY. If repairs or maintenance other than daily routine maintenance are deemed necessary as may be reasonably determined by the COUNTY, because of activity of COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s), COMPANY shall be required to make or cause to be made all reasonable repairs per Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.

Section 6. Surety Bond.

- A. Prior to the beginning of construction of the PROJECT, COMPANY shall provide to the COUNTY financial security in the form of a Surety Bond in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) which the COUNTY may draw against in the event and only to the extent that COMPANY fails to pay for the repair and or restoration expenses for County Highways in accordance with the terms of this AGREEMENT. The Surety Bond shall be issued by a bank or other financial entity with a rating of AA or better and in such form as is reasonably acceptable to the COUNTY.
- B. The Surety Bond shall remain in place from a date thirty (30) days prior to the beginning of construction of the PROJECT, including the transportation of materials or equipment on the roads identified on EXHIBIT A that are subject to this AGREEMENT until a full settlement and release of any road issues is executed by the COUNTY and COMPANY, or for six (6) months after PROJECT completion, whichever is later. For avoidance of doubt, the completion date shall be the date that the entire PROJECT is placed into service. The COUNTY agrees to (I) conduct all necessary post-construction reviews in a timely manner, not to exceed 21 days) and (II) to timely deliver any certification required for the surrender of the Surety Bond when COMPANY is no longer required to provide the Surety Bond pursuant to the terms hereof, or the terms of the Surety Bond.
- C. For so long as COMPANY is required to maintain the Surety Bond pursuant to the terms hereof, the COUNTY shall be entitled to draw down the full outstanding amount of such Surety Bond as a result of COMPANY's' failure or default to repair or restore the County Highways in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. The County shall not make any claim on said Surety Bond until sixty (60) days after the mailing of a written notice to COMPANY specifying a default hereunder by COMPANY, during which sixty (60) days COMPANY may cure such default.
- D. This Agreement shall set forth, among other things, the disbursement procedures for the Surety Bond and shall include:

- a. For damage during construction to the roads listed on EXHIBIT A, as amended from time to time and those roads damaged by incidental or accidental use:
 - Upon notification by the COUNTY, COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) shall make all temporary road repairs necessitated by COMPANY's activities at COMPANY's cost.
 - ii. Should COMPANY or its duly obligated contractor fail to complete the temporary repair within the time period mutually agreed to by COMPANY and the COUNTY, the temporary repair work shall be performed by the COUNY. Payment for such work shall be made by COMPANY.
 - iii. Final repairs to County Highways shall be completed as described in Section 6(b) of this AGREEMENT.
- b. For post construction final repairs or restoration of County Highways listed on EXIHIBIT A, as such Exhibit may be amended by the Parties from time to time:
 - i. The COUNTY shall prepare and provide a reasonable estimate of cost for the work to be completed.
 - ii. Payment for the repairs and restoration shall be made by COMPANY in the form of direct monetary compensation equal to the final repair or restoration cost, plus any reasonable survey, design, and construction inspection costs incurred by the COUNTY. The survey, design and construction inspection cost shall either be based on the percentage of the estimated cost or those fees charged by a consultant providing the services to the COUNTY. The cost percentages shall be those approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation for the COUNTY.
 - iii. Upon completion of or upon receipt of the necessary funds to complete the final repairs or restoration, as detailed above, the COUNY shall provide COMPANY with a Release of Claims in connection with COMPANY's obligations pursuant to this AGREEMENT. The COUNTY reserves the right to have such Release of Claims be provided on system wide or individual unit basis.

- iv. Upon receipt of the necessary funds to complete the final repairs or restoration, the final repair or restoration work shall be completed at the discretion of the COUNTY.
- c. Emergency repairs: Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) are reasonably believed by the COUNTY to have caused damage to County Highways of a magnitude sufficiently great to create a hazard to the motoring public, which in the COUNTY's reasonable opinion warrants an immediate repair or road closing, the COUNTY may unilaterally make or authorize repair, with the reasonable, documented costs thereof to be paid by COMPANY within thirty (30) days of the date of an invoice is submitted for reimbursement. The COUNTY shall photograph, videotape, or otherwise document the conditions and make all such documentation available to COMPANY. Any such emergency repair shall be subject to post-repair negotiations by the PARTIES, involvement of a neutral third-party intermediary and if necessary, adjudication. If such post repair proceedings favor COMPANY, the COUNTY shall reimburse COMPANY of amounts paid to fund the repair, if any.
- d. Procedure for Dispute Resolution:
 - The County shall notify COMPANY of the location and nature of the repair or restoration required, provide an estimate of cost and a time frame for completion of the work.
 - ii. If COMPANY agrees, the COUNTY or COUNTY's contractor shall perform the repair in the time frame specified and recover its cost from COMPANY to be paid within thirty (30) days of the date an invoice is submitted by the COUNTY for reimbursement.
 - iii. Should a disagreement exist as to the:
 - 1. Extent of the damage done to a County Highway based upon the pre- and post-construction inspections of the County Highway;
 - 2. Method, procedure or design used for the preparation of an estimate of a final repair or restoration of a County Highway;

3. Estimate of Cost-plus feel for a final repair or restoration of a County Highway

The County and COMPANY will in good faith attempt to resolve the dispute. If, following such a good faith attempt, the PARTIES are still unable to resolve the dispute, the PARTIES shall select a qualified independent third-party road engineer for review and to act a s a neutral intermediary to mediate the dispute within five (5) days of the effective date of such appointment. If the PARTIES cannot agree on a qualified independent third-party road engineer, then each PARTY shall select a qualified independent road engineer, and those two shall select a third qualified independent third-party engineer, and the three engineers shall provide to the PARTIES an "intermediary proposed solution". Each PARTY shall pay the cost of their engineer and the cost of the third qualified independent third-party engineer shall be split equally between the PARTIES.

- e. If the PARTIES agree and/or don't reject the intermediary's proposed solution, then the COUNTY shall proceed in accordance with the agreed upon solution, complete the final repairs or restoration of the County Highway and shall recover the associated costs from COMPANY or the Surety Bond as described in Section 6 herein.
- f. If the Parties cannot agree and the COUNTY rejects the "intermediary proposed solution", the COUNTY may take unilateral action to prevent harm or protect public safety or the further degradation of its infrastructure, the cost of which shall be paid by COMPANY, or by making a claim against the Surety Bond. If the appropriateness of the COUNTY action is ultimately determined not be justified either by agreement or adjudication, the COUNTY shall promptly refund to COMPANY the amounts paid for the final repairs or restoration of the County Highway.
- g. For the purposes of temporary or emergency repairs, the COUNTY charges shall be based on the COUNTY maintained time and material cost records, which shall be made available to COMPANY for review. COUNTY billing rates for labor shall be those established by the COUNTY and in regards to equipment and machinery, those rates approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation or the Federal Highway Administration.

- A. Indemnification by COMPANY: COMPANY hereby releases and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the COUNTY and their respective officers, employees, elected or appointed officials, and agents, and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, (hereinafter collectively successors. and assigns Releasees") from any and all actions, causes of action, suits, claims, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) and demands against the County Releasees arising out of or relating to the performance by COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) of their obligations under this Agreement. More particularly, but without in any way limiting the foregoing, COMPANY hereby releases the County Releasees and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County Releasees from any and all actions, causes of action, suits, claims, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) and demands arising directly or indirectly from any personal injury, death or property damage arising out of the use, construction, modifications, repairs, or improvement of any road subject to this Agreement by COMPANY, its employees, agents, representative, material suppliers, vendors, transport providers, or contractors, or their respective employees, agents or representatives.
- B. Indemnification by the County: The COUNTY hereby releases and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless COMPANY and their contractors. subcontractors. members, officers. directors, employees, and agents, and their respective employees, heirs, executors, administrators, successor and assigns (hereinafter collectively COMPANY Releasees") from any and all actions, causes of action, suits, claims, expense (including reasonable attorney's fees) and demands against the COMPANY Releasees arising out of or relating to the performance by the COUNTY of its obligations under this Agreement. More particularly, but without in any way limiting the foregoing, the COUNTY hereby releases the COMPANY Releasees and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the COMPANY Releasees from any and all actions, causes of action, suits, claims, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) and demands arising directly or indirectly from any personal injury, death, or property damage arising out of the use, construction, modifications, repair or improvement of any road subject to his Agreement by the COUNTY, their respective employees, agents representative, suppliers, or contractors, or their respective employees, agents or representatives
- C. Limitation of Liability: In no event shall either PARTY or their officers or employees be liable (in contract or in tort, involving negligence strict liability, or otherwise) to any other PARTY or their contractors,

suppliers, employees, members and shareholders for indirect, special, incidental, consequential, or punitive damages resulting from the performance, non-performance or delay in performance under this Agreement. In addition, with the exception of any liability arising pursuant to Section 7(A) herein, or in a case of willful misconduct or fraud, COMPANY's liability to the COUNTY shall be limited to the amount of the Surety Bond requirement established in Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.

- D. Required Insurance: COMPANY shall at all times throughout the term of this Agreement, maintain in full force and effect, the following insurance set forth on the attached Certificate of Insurance (EXHIBIT B) to wit:
 - a. Worker's Compensation Insurance covering all employees engaged in the work to the limits required by the applicable laws in the jurisdiction in which the PROJECT is being constructed.
 - b. Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance covering all motor vehicles, owned, operated, and or licensed or leased by COMPANY and engaged in the construction of the PROJECT. Limits of liability shall not be less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the accidental injury to or death of one or more persons, or damage to or destruction of property per occurrence.
 - c. Commercial General Liability Insurance with minimum limits of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) per occurrence. Without restricting the generality of the foregoing, such coverage shall include but not be limited to bodily injury and property damage, non-owned automobile, sudden, and accidental pollution liability, employer's liability, products and completed operations and contractual liability. COMPANY shall request its insurer add the County of Kankakee, Illinois its Board, officers and employees as additional insured to the Commercial General Liability policy in this Section.
 - d. General Provisions Applicable to the Foregoing Insurance Requirements
 - i. COMPANY may utilize any combination of primary and/or excess insurance to satisfy the above requirements

ii. Evidence of such insurance shall be submitted to the COUNTY prior to the initiation of any work or transportation of any materials or equipment on the roads listed on EXHIBIT A.

Section 8 Miscellaneous

- A. Remedies and Enforcement: The PARTIES hereto covenant and agree that in the event of default of any of the terms, provisions, or conditions of this AGREEMENT by any PARTY (the "Defaulting Party), which default is not caused by the PARTY seeking to enforce said provisions (the "Non-Defaulting Party") and after notice and reasonable opportunity to cure has been provided to the Defaulting Party, then in such an event, the Non-Defaulting Party shall have the right of specific performance and injunctive relief. The remedy of specific performance and injunctive relief shall not be exclusive and the Non-Defaulting Party may seek any other remedy available at law or in equity.
- B. Non-Waiver of Performance. Failure of either PARTY to insist upon the strict and prompt performance of the terms, covenants, agreements, and conditions herein contained or any of them upon the other PARTY imposed shall not constitute or be construed as a waiver or relinquishment of either PARTY's right thereafter to enforce any such terms, covenants, agreements, and conditions, but the same shall continue in full force and effect.
- C. Severability. If any provisions of this AGREEMENT are held invalid under any applicable law, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this AGREEMENT that can be given effect without the invalid provision and to this end, the provisions hereof are severable.
- D. Amendments. No amendments or modification to this AGREEMENT or waiver of a PARTY's rights hereunder shall be binding unless it shall be in writing and signed by both PARTIES.
- E. Notices: All notices shall be in writing and sent (including via facsimile transmission) to the PARTIES hereto at their respective address or fax numbers (or to such other address or fax number as any such PARTY shall designate in writing to the other PARTY from time to time)

- F. Assignment: This AGREEMENT may be assigned by COMPANY for purposes of financing the PROJECT without the consent or approval of COUNTY. In all other instances, this AGREEMENT may not be assigned without the written consent of the other PARTY.
- G. Counterparts: This AGREEMENT may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, with the same effect as if the signatures thereto and hereto were upon the instrument. Delivery of an executed counterpart of a signature page to this AGREEMENT by telecopy shall be as effective as delivery of a manually signed counterpart to this AGREEMENT.

- H. Governing Law: This AGREEMENT shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois and any litigation shall take place in the Twenty First Judicial Circuit Court.
- I. Successors and Assigns: This AGREEMENT shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the PARTIES hereto, their respective successors, permitted assignees, legal representatives, and their respective agents, contractors, subcontractors, material suppliers, vendors, employees, respective transport providers and designees
- J. Termination: COMPANY shall have the right to terminate this AGREEMENT at any time for convenience by providing fifteen (15) days prior written notice to the COUNTY of its intent to terminate this AGREEMENT. In the event such termination occurs, the Surety Bond shall remain in place as follows, rather than the date specified in Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.
 - a. In the event such termination occurs prior to the beginning of construction of the PROJECT including the transportation of material or equipment on the roads identified on EXHIBIT A that are subject to this Agreement, then notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Surety Bond shall be returned to COMPANY and COMPANY shall have no further liability to the COUNTY under this AGREEMENT.
 - b. In the event such termination occurs during PROJECT construction but prior to completion of the PROJECT", the Surety Bond shall remain in place until any necessary repairs to County Highways are completed by COMPANY, or if the COUNTY has completed such necessary repairs, until the cost for the same has been reimbursed to the COUNTY.
 - c. In the event the PROJECT is permanently abandoned by COMPANY, the Surety Bond shall remain in place until any necessary repairs to County Highways are completed by COMPANY, or if the COUNTY has completed such necessary repairs, until the cost for the same has been reimbursed to the COUNTY.
- K. Due Authorization: This AGREEMENT contains the entire understanding of the PARTIES as to the matters set forth herein, and this AGREEMENT supersedes any prior agreements or understanding by and between PARTIES, whether written or oral. Illinois Prevailing Wage Act: With regard to any work performed on County Highways in connection with the construction of the PROJECT, COMPANY and COMPANY Representative(s) shall pay wages in accordance with the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/0.0/ et seq. The parties agree that certification by COMPANY's Management that wages are paid in accordance with the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act shall be acceptable to the COUNTY unless otherwise required by Illinois State Statute.

Kankakee County Highway Department Road Use Agreement

This Road Use Agreement (AGREEMENT) is made and entered into this 14th day of March, 2023 by and between the County of Kankakee, Illinois, a body corporate and politic under the Laws of the State of Illinois (COUNTY), and GRNE-Nelnet,LLC dba GRNE Solar (COMPANY). The COUNTY and COMPANY are sometimes referred to herein individually as a PARTY and collectively as the PARTIES. The term Representative(s) shall include COMPANY s contractors, subcontractors, employees, material suppliers, vendors, transport providers, representatives, and designees.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, COMPANY intends to construct a one and one half (2.436) megawatt Sun Powered Energy Generation Station and other ancillary facilities (PROJECT) in the County of Kankakee on CH 30 at 6591N 2250 W Road, Bourbonnais IL; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the construction of the PROJECT, the COUNTY desires to address certain issues relating to the roads owned and operated and maintained by the COUNTY (collectively, the County Highways) over which it will be necessary for COMPANY and COMPANY's Representative(s) to, among other things, (I) transport heavy equipment and materials over certain County Highways, which may in certain cases be in excess of the design limits of the County Highways; (II) transport certain locally sourced materials, such as concrete and aggregates, on those designated County Highways, (III) transport labor, and (IV) place utilities adjacent to, or under certain County Highways, and

WHEREAS, under 605 ILCS 5/5 et seq. the COUNTY has broad power regarding the opening, construction, maintenance, relocation, access to, or repair of highways in the County Highway system, and

WHEREAS 605 ILCS 5/9-113 grants to the COUNTY, authority to impose reasonable rules, regulations, and specifications for the use of County Highways by public and private utilities; and

WHEREAS 605 ILCS 5/9-113.01 imposes a liability on public or private utilities for any damage to County Highways; and

WHEREAS, 605 ILCS 5/9-122 imposes a liability on damage done to a bridge or culvert; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare that COMPANY and the COUNTY reach an agreement to address the majority of issues that will arise in a project of this seize; and

WHEREAS COMPANY has provided to the County Engineer of Kankakee County, Illinois (COUNTY ENGINEER) a construction plan for the Project that shows the haul routes, road crossings, access points, and construction access roads, a copy of which is attached as the Principal Road Use Schedule (EXHIBIT A); and

WHEREAS, COMPANY and the COUNTY wish to set forth their understanding and agreement as to the road issues relating to the construction and operation of the PROJECT; and

WHEREAS; this AGREEMENT shall apply to those County Highways outlined on the Plan and are included and/or otherwise referenced in EXHIBIT A.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein set forth, the PARTIES, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

SECTION 1 COMPANY agrees to undertake the following actions in accordance with the terms of this Agreement

A. Provide contact information for the COMPANY Construction Manager and Project Engineer, who will be stationed no farther that two (2) hours away from the COUNTY, and the COMPANY Permit Agent.

- B. Provide as much advance notice as is reasonable to the COUNTY ENGINEER's office in advance of all oversize and overweight vehicle moves and equipment for all routes for individual review and permitting.
- C. Transport oversize loads so as to minimize adverse impact on the local traffic.
- D. Provide as much advance notice as is commercially reasonable to obtain approval of the COUNTY when it is necessary for a road to be closed for any reason. Notwithstanding, the generality of the aforementioned, COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) will provide 48 hours' notice to the extent reasonably practicable
- E. Sign all highway work zones and closures in accordance with the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices and the Illinois Department of Transportation Supplement to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices in accordance with Chapter 430 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes and current Illinois Department of Transportation Traffic Control Standards.
- F. Keep all County Highways used by COMPANY or COMPANY Representative(s) clear, by removing all mud, dirt, dust, spilled or tracked material, garbage, obstruction, or other hazards, upon notice and within a reasonable time period.
- G. Prohibit the use of County Highway right of way as storage or staging areas and as parking areas for vehicles and equipment of all contractors, sub-contractors, employees, material suppliers, vendors, transport providers, representatives and designees.
- H. Pay for the cost of all repairs to all County Highways that are damaged by COMPANY Representative(s) during the construction of the PROJECT and restore such roads to the condition they were prior to the PROJECT's construction.
- I. Take such measures as are reasonably required during an extended work suspension to provide for safe vehicular travel on County Highways damaged as a direct result of COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) use as directed by the COUNTY. The extended work suspension may be caused by but not limited to seasonal weather conditions, "acts of God", or labor disagreements.
- J. Acknowledge that any estimates for road repairs or restorations are good faith estimates provided by the COUNTY or a consultant (who

- must be mutually approved by both PARTIES, but the final actual costs may vary.
- K. Provide a single Surety Bond in accordance with Section 6 of this AGREEMENT for the purposes of road repair or restoration
- L. Anywhere in this AGREEMENT, with the exception of any payments directed in or by Sections 5, 6, or 7 herein, that obligates COMPANY to make a payment, said payment shall be made directly to the County Highway Department within 21 days of receipt of a reasonable invoice, containing such detail as COMPANY may reasonably request, from the County Highway Department. Such payments shall be made, at COMPANY's discretion, by check or wire transfer of immediately available funds.

Section 2. The COUNTY, in accordance with the terms of this AGREEMENT, agrees to:

- A. Consent to the use of the County Highway's rights-of-way for utility encroachments for the PROJECT by separate permit. Consent granted herein shall be effective only to the extent of the property interest of the COUNTY. Such consent shall not be binding on any owner of a fee over or under which the highway is located and shall not relieve COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) from obtaining by purchase, condemnation, or otherwise the necessary approval of any owner of the fee over or under which the highway is located if such approval is legally required.
- B. Review for approval all oversize or overweight equipment using the County Highways by giving consideration of road damage and traffic safety in a reasonable manner based on accepted engineering practices and issue individual permits for those loads.
- C. Issue individual vehicle overweight and oversize permits for County Highways in a timely manner for the roads scheduled on EXHIBIT A upon the filing of such applications on behalf of COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) and concurrent with any applicable Illinois Department of Transportation OS/OW Permit(s).
- D. Coordinate with COMPANY and COMPANY's Representative(s) so as to minimize the impact of their use of the County Highway system.
- E. Perform all routine maintenance on the County Highways used for the PROJECT in accordance with Section 5 of this AGREEMENT.
- F. Review in a timely manner for approval all access points to the County Highway system by considering sight distances, drainage and proximity

- to other entrances, in a reasonable manner, and in accordance with accepted engineering practices and issue access permits.
- G. Prepare estimates in good faith based on the design of all road repairs or restorations in accordance with IDOT Bureau of Local Roads and Street Manual.
- H. Authorize the County Engineer to agree on behalf of the County to revisions to EXHIBIT A and to determine appropriate improvements.

Section 3. Road Inventory

- A. Pre-Construction Inspection: COMPANY or COMPANY's representatives, prior to commencement of construction, shall jointly prepare with COUNTY staff a video recording inspection of the condition of the pavement surface of the Routes specified in EXHIBIT A. That work shall be coordinated with the COUNTY. During the video survey, the entire length of the roads as listed in EXHIBIT A shall be videotaped
- B. Post-Construction Inspection: Upon completion of the PROJECT, COMPANY shall contact the COUNTY and arrange for a timely (within 7 days) a post-construction inspection. Any damage discovered that can be reasonably attributed to the PROJECT shall be repaired to the satisfaction of the COUNTY by COMPANY.
- C. Incidental/Accidental Use: The PARTIES recognize that the PROJECT traffic may, either through mistake or with the consent of the COUNTY, use roads or access points other than those listed on EXHIBIT A. Repairs for damage caused by COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) during such mistaken or permitted use shall be paid for or repaired as provided in Sections 5 and 6 of this AGREEMENT, as applicable.

Section 4. Construction Cooperation:

A. Prior to the commencement of PORJECT construction COMPANY shall provide the COUNTY with 48 hours' notice prior to beginning any work.

<u>Section 5</u>. Maintenance of the County Highways

A. The daily routine maintenance of the County Highways being utilized by the PROJECT including snow removal, striping and routine signage and regularly scheduled maintenance or repair shall be the responsibility of the COUNTY. If repairs or maintenance other than daily routine maintenance are deemed necessary as may be reasonably determined by the COUNTY, because of activity of COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s), COMPANY shall be required to make or cause to be made all reasonable repairs per Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.

Section 6. Surety Bond.

- A. Prior to the beginning of construction of the PROJECT, COMPANY shall provide to the COUNTY financial security in the form of a Surety Bond in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) which the COUNTY may draw against in the event and only to the extent that COMPANY fails to pay for the repair and or restoration expenses for County Highways in accordance with the terms of this AGREEMENT. The Surety Bond shall be issued by a bank or other financial entity with a rating of AA or better and in such form as is reasonably acceptable to the COUNTY.
- B. The Surety Bond shall remain in place from a date thirty (30) days prior to the beginning of construction of the PROJECT, including the transportation of materials or equipment on the roads identified on EXHIBIT A that are subject to this AGREEMENT until a full settlement and release of any road issues is executed by the COUNTY and COMPANY, or for six (6) months after PROJECT completion, whichever is later. For avoidance of doubt, the completion date shall be the date that the entire PROJECT is placed into service. The COUNTY agrees to (I) conduct all necessary post-construction reviews in a timely manner, not to exceed 21 days) and (II) to timely deliver any certification required for the surrender of the Surety Bond when COMPANY is no longer required to provide the Surety Bond pursuant to the terms hereof, or the terms of the Surety Bond.
- C. For so long as COMPANY is required to maintain the Surety Bond pursuant to the terms hereof, the COUNTY shall be entitled to draw down the full outstanding amount of such Surety Bond as a result of COMPANY's' failure or default to repair or restore the County Highways in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. The County shall not make any claim on said Surety Bond until sixty (60) days after the mailing of a written notice to COMPANY specifying a default hereunder by COMPANY, during which sixty (60) days COMPANY may cure such default.
- D. The Surety Bond Agreement shall set forth, among other things, the disbursement procedures for the Surety Bond and shall include:
 - a. For damage during construction to the roads listed on EXHIBIT A, as amended from time to time and those roads damaged by incidental or accidental use:

- Upon notification by the COUNTY, COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) shall make all temporary road repairs necessitated by COMPANY's activities at COMPANY's cost.
- ii. Should COMPANY or its duly obligated contractor fail to complete the temporary repair within the time period mutually agreed to by COMPANY and the COUNTY, the temporary repair work shall be performed by the COUNY. Payment for such work shall be made by COMPANY.
- iii. Final repairs to County Highways shall be completed as described in Section 6(b) of this AGREEMENT.
- b. For post construction final repairs or restoration of County Highways listed on EXIHIBIT A, as such Exhibit may be amended by the Parties from time to time:
 - i. The COUNTY shall prepare and provide a reasonable estimate of cost for the work to be completed.
 - ii. Payment for the repairs and restoration shall be made by COMPANY in the form of direct monetary compensation equal to the final repair or restoration cost, plus any reasonable survey, design, and construction inspection costs incurred by the COUNTY. The survey, design and construction inspection cost shall either be based on the percentage of the estimated cost or those fees charged by a consultant providing the services to the COUNTY. The cost percentages shall be those approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation for the COUNTY.
 - iii. Upon completion of or upon receipt of the necessary funds to complete the final repairs or restoration, as detailed above, the COUNY shall provide COMPANY with a Release of Claims in connection with COMPANY's obligations pursuant to this AGREEMENT. The COUNTY reserves the right to have such Release of Claims be provided on system wide or individual unit basis.
 - iv. Upon receipt of the necessary funds to complete the final repairs or restoration, the final repair or restoration work shall be completed at the discretion of the COUNTY.

c. Emergency repairs: Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) are reasonably believed by the COUNTY to have caused damage to County Highways of a magnitude sufficiently great to create a hazard to the motoring public, which in the COUNTY's reasonable opinion warrants an immediate repair or road closing, the COUNTY may unilaterally make or authorize repair, with the reasonable, documented costs thereof to be paid by COMPANY within thirty (30) days of the date of an invoice is submitted for reimbursement. The COUNTY shall photograph, videotape, or otherwise document the conditions and make all such documentation available to COMPANY. Any such emergency repair shall be subject to post-repair negotiations by the PARTIES, involvement of a neutral third-party intermediary and if necessary, adjudication. If such post repair proceedings favor COMPANY, the COUNTY shall reimburse COMPANY of amounts paid to fund the repair, if any.

d. Procedure for Dispute Resolution:

- The County shall notify COMPANY of the location and nature of the repair or restoration required, provide an estimate of cost and a time frame for completion of the work.
- ii. If COMPANY agrees, the COUNTY or COUNTY's contractor shall perform the repair in the time frame specified and recover its cost from COMPANY to be paid within thirty (30) days of the date an invoice is submitted by the COUNTY for reimbursement.

iii. Should a disagreement exist as to the:

- 1. Extent of the damage done to a County Highway based upon the pre- and post-construction inspections of the County Highway;
- Method, procedure or design used for the preparation of an estimate of a final repair or restoration of a County Highway;
- 3. Estimate of Cost-plus feel for a final repair or restoration of a County Highway

The County and COMPANY will in good faith attempt to resolve the dispute. If, following such a good faith attempt,

the PARTIES are still unable to resolve the dispute, the PARTIES shall select a qualified independent third-party road engineer for review and to act a s a neutral intermediary to mediate the dispute within five (5) days of the effective date of such appointment. If the PARTIES cannot agree on a qualified independent third-party road engineer, then each PARTY shall select a qualified independent road engineer, and those two shall select a third qualified independent third-party engineer, and the three engineers shall provide to the PARTIES an "intermediary proposed solution". Each PARTY shall pay the cost of their engineer and the cost of the third qualified independent third-party engineer shall be split equally between the PARTIES.

- e. If the PARTIES agree and/or don't reject the intermediary's proposed solution, then the COUNTY shall proceed in accordance with the agreed upon solution, complete the final repairs or restoration of the County Highway and shall recover the associated costs from COMPANY or the Surety Bond as described in Section 6 herein.
- f. If the Parties cannot agree and the COUNTY rejects the "intermediary proposed solution", the COUNTY may take unilateral action to prevent harm or protect public safety or the further degradation of its infrastructure, the cost of which shall be paid by COMPANY, or by making a claim against the Surety Bond. If the appropriateness of the COUNTY action is ultimately determined not be justified either by agreement or adjudication, the COUNTY shall promptly refund to COMPANY the amounts paid for the final repairs or restoration of the County Highway.
- g. For the purposes of temporary or emergency repairs, the COUNTY charges shall be based on the COUNTY maintained time and material cost records, which shall be made available to COMPANY for review. COUNTY billing rates for labor shall be those established by the COUNTY and in regards to equipment and machinery, those rates approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation or the Federal Highway Administration.

Section 7. Mutual Indemnification/Hold Harmless and Liability Insurance Provisions

A. Indemnification by COMPANY: COMPANY hereby releases and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the COUNTY and their respective officers, employees, elected or appointed officials, and agents, and their respective heirs, executors, administrators,

assigns (hereinafter collectively successors. and "County Releasees") from any and all actions, causes of action, suits, claims, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) and demands against the County Releasees arising out of or relating to the performance by COMPANY or COMPANY's Representative(s) of their obligations under this Agreement. More particularly, but without in any way limiting the foregoing, COMPANY hereby releases the County Releasees and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County Releasees from any and all actions, causes of action, suits, claims, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) and demands arising directly or indirectly from any personal injury, death or property damage arising out of the use, construction, modifications, repairs, or improvement of any road subject to this Agreement by COMPANY, its employees, agents, representative, material suppliers, vendors, transport providers, or contractors, or their respective employees, agents or representatives.

- B. Indemnification by the County: The COUNTY hereby releases and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless COMPANY and their members. officers. directors. contractors. subcontractors. employees, and agents, and their respective employees, heirs, executors, administrators, successor and assigns (hereinafter collectively COMPANY Releasees") from any and all actions, causes of action, suits, claims, expense (including reasonable attorney's fees) and demands against the COMPANY Releasees arising out of or relating to the performance by the COUNTY of its obligations under this Agreement. More particularly, but without in any way limiting the foregoing, the COUNTY hereby releases the COMPANY Releasees and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the COMPANY Releasees from any and all actions, causes of action, suits, claims, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) and demands arising directly or indirectly from any personal injury, death, or property damage arising out of the use, construction, modifications, repair or improvement of any road subject to his Agreement by the COUNTY, their respective employees, agents representative, suppliers, or contractors, or their respective employees, agents or representatives
- C. Limitation of Liability: In no event shall either PARTY or their officers or employees be liable (in contract or in tort, involving negligence strict liability, or otherwise) to any other PARTY or their contractors, suppliers, employees, members and shareholders for indirect, special, incidental, consequential, or punitive damages resulting from the performance, non-performance or delay in performance under this Agreement. In addition, with the exception of any liability arising pursuant to Section 7(A) herein, or in a case of willful

misconduct or fraud, COMPANY's liability to the COUNTY shall be limited to the amount of the Surety Bond requirement established in Section 6 of this AGREEMENT.

- D. Required Insurance: COMPANY shall at all times throughout the term of this Agreement, maintain in full force and effect, the following insurance set forth on the attached Certificate of Insurance (EXHIBIT B) to wit:
 - a. Worker's Compensation Insurance covering all employees engaged in the work to the limits required by the applicable laws in the jurisdiction in which the PROJECT is being constructed.
 - b. Commercial Automobile Liability Insurance covering all motor vehicles, owned, operated, and or licensed or leased by COMPANY and engaged in the construction of the PROJECT. Limits of liability shall not be less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the accidental injury to or death of one or more persons, or damage to or destruction of property per occurrence.
 - c. Commercial General Liability Insurance with minimum limits of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) per occurrence. Without restricting the generality of the foregoing, such coverage shall include but not be limited to bodily injury and property damage, non-owned automobile, sudden, and accidental pollution liability, employer's liability, products and completed operations and contractual liability. COMPANY shall request its insurer add the County of Kankakee, Illinois its Board, officers and employees as additional insured to the Commercial General Liability policy in this Section.
 - d. General Provisions Applicable to the Foregoing Insurance Requirements
 - i. COMPANY may utilize any combination of primary and/or excess insurance to satisfy the above requirements
 - ii. Evidence of such insurance shall be submitted to the COUNTY prior to the initiation of any work or transportation of any materials or equipment on the roads listed on EXHIBIT A.

Section 8 Miscellaneous

- A. Remedies and Enforcement: The PARTIES hereto covenant and agree that in the event of default of any of the terms, provisions, or conditions of this AGREEMENT by any PARTY (the "Defaulting Party), which default is not caused by the PARTY seeking to enforce said provisions (the "Non-Defaulting Party") and after notice and reasonable opportunity to cure has been provided to the Defaulting Party, then in such an event, the Non-Defaulting Party shall have the right of specific performance and injunctive relief. - C. Severability. If any provisions of this AGREEMENT are held invalid under any applicable law, such invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this AGREEMENT that can be given effect without the invalid provision and to this end, the provisions hereof are severable.
- D. Amendments. No amendments or modification to this AGREEMENT or waiver of a PARTY's rights hereunder shall be binding unless it shall be in writing and signed by both PARTIES.
- E. Notices: All notices shall be in writing and sent (including via facsimile transmission) to the PARTIES hereto at their respective address or fax numbers (or to such other address or fax number as any such PARTY shall designate in writing to the other PARTY from time to time)

Illinois Prevailing Wage Act: With regard to any work performed on County Highways in connection with the construction of the PROJECT, COMPANY and COMPANY Representative(s) shall pay wages in accordance with the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/0.0/ et seq. The parties agree that certification by COMPANY's Management that wages are paid in accordance with the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act

shall be acceptable to the COUNTY unless otherwise required by Illinois State Statute.

- To perform or be responsible for the performance of the Scope of Services presented in EXHIBIT A for the LPA in connection with the proposed improvements herein before described.

 hours. If higher-salaried personnel of the firm, including the Principal Engineer, perform services that are to be performed by

That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for the accuracy of the work and shall promptly make necessary revisions or corrections required as a result of the ENGINEER'S error, omissions or negligent acts without additional compensation. - 5. To pay its subconsultants for satisfactory performance no later than 30 days from receipt of each payment from the LPA.
- 6. To invoice the LPA, The ENGINEER shall submit all invoices to the LPA within three months of the completion of the work called for in the AGREEMENT or any subsequent Amendment or Supplement.
- 7. The ENGINEER or subconsultant shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the performance of this AGREEMENT. The ENGINEER shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR part 26 in the administration of US Department of Transportation (US DOT) assisted contract. Failure by the Engineer to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this AGREEMENT, which may result in the termination of this AGREEMENT or such other remedy as the LPA deems appropriate.
- 8. That none of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall be sublet, assigned or transferred to any other party or parties without written consent of the LPA. The consent to sublet, assign or otherwise transfer any portion of the services to be furnished by the ENGINEER shall be construed to relieve the ENGINEER of any responsibility for the fulfillment of this AGREEMENT.
- 9. For Preliminary Engineering Contracts:
 - (a) To attend meetings and visit the site of the proposed improvement when requested to do so by representatives of the LPA or the DEPARTMENT, as defined in Exhibit A (Scope of Services).
 - (b) That all plans and other documents furnished by the ENGINEER pursuant to the AGREEMENT will be endorsed by the ENGINEER and affixed the ENGINEER's professional seal when such seal is required by law. Such endorsements must be made by a person, duly licensed or registered in the appropriate category by the Department of Professional Regulation of the State of Illinois. It will be the ENGINEER's responsibility to affix the proper seal as required by the Bureau of Local Roads and Streets manual published by the DEPARTMENT.
 - (c) That the ENGINEER is qualified technically and is thoroughly conversant with the design standards and policies applicable for the PROJECT; and that the ENGINEER has sufficient properly trained, organized and experienced personnel to perform the services enumerated in Exhibit A (Scope of Services).

The recipient shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national original or sex in the award and performance of any US DOT-assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR part 26. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this section shall establish a presumption in favor of the DEPARTMENT for the recovery of any funds paid by the DEPARTMENT under the contract for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- 2. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any all damages to property or persons out of an error, omission and/or negligent act in the prosecution of the ENGINEER's work and shall indemnify and save harmless the LPA, the DEPARTMENT, and their officers, agents and employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages liabilities, costs or damages of any nature whatsoever resulting there from. These indemnities shall not be limited by the listing of any insurance policy.
 - The LPA will notify the ENGINEER of any error or omission believed by the LPA to be caused by the negligence of the ENGINEER as soon as practicable after the discovery. The LPA reserves the right to take immediate action to remedy any error or omission if notification is not successful; if the ENGINEER fails to reply to a notification; or if the conditions created by the error or omission are in need of urgent correction to avoid accumulation of additional construction costs or damages to property and reasonable notice is not practicable.
- 3. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by the LPA upon giving notice in writing to the ENGINEER at the ENGINEER's last known post office address. Upon such termination, the ENGINEER shall cause to be delivered to the LPA all drawings, plats, surveys, reports, permits, agreements, soils and foundation analysis, provisions, specifications, partial and completed estimates and data, if any from soil survey and subsurface investigation with the understanding that all such materials becomes the property of the LPA. The LPA will be responsible for reimbursement of all eligible expenses incurred under the terms of this AGREEMENT up to the date of the written notice of termination.

- 4. In the event that the DEPARTMENT stops payment to the LPA, the LPA may suspend work on the project. If this agreement is suspended by the LPA for more than thirty (30) calendar days, consecutive or in aggregate, over the term of this AGREEMENT, the ENGINEER shall be compensated for all services performed and reimbursable expenses incurred prior to receipt of notice of suspension. In addition, upon the resumption of services the LPA shall compensate the ENGINEER, for expenses incurred as a result of the suspension and resumption of its services, and the ENGINEER's schedule and fees for the remainder of the project shall be equitably adjusted.
- 5. This AGREEMENT shall continue as an open contract and the obligations created herein shall remain in full force and effect until the completion of construction of any phase of professional services performed by others based upon the service provided herein. All obligations of the ENGINEER accepted under this AGREEMENT shall cease if construction or subsequent professional services are not commenced within 5 years after final payment by the LPA.
- 6. That the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons arising out of an error, omission and/or negligent act in the prosecution of the ENGINEER's work and shall indemnify and have harmless the LPA, the DEPARTMENT, and their officers, employees from all suits, claims, actions or damages liabilities, costs or damages of any nature whatsoever resulting there from. These indemnities shall not be limited by the listing of any insurance policy.
- 7. The ENGINEER and LPA certify that their respective firm or agency:
 - (a) has not employed or retained for commission, percentage, brokerage, contingent fee or other considerations, any firm or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for the LPA or the ENGINEER) to solicit or secure this AGREEMENT.
 - (b) has not agreed, as an express or implied condition for obtaining this AGREEMENT, to employ or retain the services of any firm or person in connection with carrying out the AGREEMENT or
 - (c) has not paid, or agreed to pay any firm, organization or person (other than a bona fide employee working solely for the LPA or the ENGINEER) any fee, contribution, donation or consideration of any kind for, or in connection with, procuring or carrying out the AGREEMENT.
 - (d) that neither the ENGINEER nor the LPA is/are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal department or agency,
 - (e) has not within a three-year period preceding the AGREEMENT been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements or receiving stolen property.
 - (f) are not presently indicated for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (Federal, State, or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph and
 - (g) has not within a three-year period preceding this AGREEMENT had one or more public transaction (Federal, State, local) terminated for cause or default.

Where the ENGINEER or LPA is unable to certify to any of the above statements in this clarification, an explanation shall be attached to this AGREEMENT.

- 8. In the event of delays due to unforeseeable causes beyond the control of and without fault or negligence of the ENGINEER no claim for damages shall be made by either party. Termination of the AGREEMENT or adjustment of the fee for the remaining services may be requested by either party if the overall delay from the unforeseen causes prevents completion of the work within six months after the specified completion date. Examples of unforeseen causes included but are not limited to: acts of God or a public enemy; acts of the LPA, DEPARTMENT, or other approving party not resulting from the ENGINEER's unacceptable services; fire; strikes; and floods.
 - If delays occur due to any cause preventing compliance with the PROJECT SCHEDULE, the ENGINEER shall apply in writing to the LPA for an extension of time. If approved, the PROJECT SCHEDULE shall be revised accordingly.
- 9. This certification is required by the Drug Free Workplace Act (30 ILCS 580). The Drug Free Workplace Act requires that no grantee or contractor shall receive a grant or be considered for the purpose of being awarded a contract for the procurement of any property or service from the DEPARTMENT unless that grantee or contractor will provide a drug free workplace. False certification or violation of the certification may result in sanctions including, but not limited to suspension of contract on grant payments, termination of a contract or grant and debarment of the contracting or grant opportunities with the DEPARTMENT for at least one (1) year but not more than (5) years.

For the purpose of this certification, "grantee" or "Contractor" means a corporation, partnership or an entity with twenty-five (25) or more employees at the time of issuing the grant or a department, division or other unit thereof, directly responsible for the specific performance under contract or grant of \$5,000 or more from the DEPARTMENT, as defined the Act.

The contractor/grantee certifies and agrees that it will provide a drug free workplace by:

- (a) Publishing a statement:
 - (1) Notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance, including cannabis, is prohibited in the grantee's or contractor's workplace.
 - (2) Specifying actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition.
 - (3) Notifying the employee that, as a condition of employment on such contract or grant, the employee will:
 - (a) abide by the terms of the statement; and
 - (b) notify the employer of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than (5) days after such conviction.
- (b) Establishing a drug free awareness program to inform employees about:
 - (1) The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;

- (2) The grantee's or contractor's policy to maintain a drug free workplace;
- (3) Any available drug counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance program; and
- (4) The penalties that may be imposed upon an employee for drug violations.
- (c) Providing a copy of the statement required by subparagraph (a) to each employee engaged in the performance of the contract or grant and to post the statement in a prominent place in the workplace.
- (d) Notifying the contracting, or granting agency within ten (10) days after receiving notice under part (b) of paragraph (3) of subsection (a) above from an employee or otherwise, receiving actual notice of such conviction.
- (e) Imposing a sanction on, or requiring the satisfactory participation in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program.
- (f) Assisting employees in selecting a course of action in the event drug counseling, treatment and rehabilitation is required and indicating that a trained referral team is in place.

Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug free workplace through implementation of the Drug Free Workplace Act, the ENGINEER, LPA and the Department agree to meet the PROJECT SCHEDULE outlined in EXHIBIT B. Time is of the essence on this project and the ENGINEER's ability to meet the PROJECT SCHEDULE will be a factor in the LPA selecting the ENGINEER for future projects. The ENGINEER will submit progress reports with each invoice showing work that was completed during the last reporting period and work they expect to accomplish during the following period.

- 10. Due to the physical location of the project, certain work classifications may be subject to the Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.).
- 11. For Preliminary Engineering Contracts:
 - (a) That tracing, plans, specifications, estimates, maps and other documents prepared by the ENGINEER in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be delivered to and become the property of the LPA and that basic survey notes, sketches, charts, CADD files, related electronic files, and other data prepared or obtained in accordance with this AGREEMENT shall be made available, upon request to the LPA or to the DEPARTMENT, without restriction or limitation as to their use. Any re-use of these documents without the ENGINEER involvement shall be at the LPA's sole risk and will not impose liability upon the ENGINEER.
 - (b) That all reports, plans, estimates and special provisions furnished by the ENGINEER shall conform to the current Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, Bureau of Local Roads and Streets Manual or any other applicable requirements of the DEPARTMENT, it being understood that all such furnished documents shall be approved by the LPA and the DEPARTMENT before final acceptance. During the performance of the engineering services herein provided for, the ENGINEER shall be responsible for any loss or damage to the documents herein enumerated while they are in the ENGINEER's possession and any such loss or damage shall be restored at the ENGINEER's expense.

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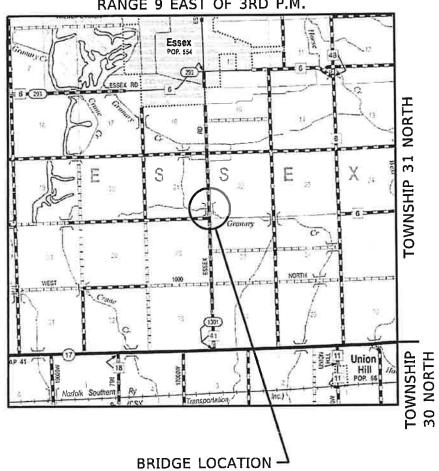

Lessee represents that the vehicles being leased are and will be used solely in connection with Lessee's obligations to Kankakee County in providing transportation services pursuant to Section 5311 of the Federal Transit Act of 1991 for Public Transportation Operating Assistance and pursuant to the Illinois Downstate Public Transportation Act (30 ILCS 740/2-1, et. seq.). Lessee's administrative office address is 510 Hoselton Drive, Chenoa, IL 61726.

1. TERM The term of this lease is three years from the date the lease is signed. On lease term expiration, the Lessee shall return the vehicles to the Lessor unless the parties hereto enter into a new or renewed lease agreement on or before that date.

- 2. RENT The Lessee agrees to pay to Lessor the sum of \$1.00 dollar during the term of the Lease Agreement. However, in consideration of having the use of the vehicles for the term and purposes set out herein, the Lessee agrees as follows:
- 3. LESSEE'S WARRANTIES Lessee agrees and warrants that the vehicles have been delivered to Lessee in good operating condition and are free of defects and are suitable for the intended use of the Lessee. Lessee warrants that it and all persons who will operate the vehicles hold currently valid driver's licenses issued by the State of Illinois and that neither Lessee nor such other operators have been convicted of such traffic violations or have such a traffic accident record as would be cause for cancellation of the insurance required hereunder.
- 4. INSURANCE Lessee shall supply at its sole expense, and maintain in full force and effect during the term of the lease and thereafter until the vehicles have been returned to the Lessor, a policy or policies of insurance written by a company satisfactory to the Lessor, by the terms of which Lessor and Lessee, together and severally, are named as the insureds and are protected against liability and/or loss arising out of the condition, maintenance, use, or operation of the vehicles herein leased, in amounts not less than \$3,000,000 combined single limits for property damage, bodily injury, or death; \$350,000 uninsured/underinsured motorists coverage; with deductible amounts not exceeding \$1,000 comprehensive and \$1,000 collision. Such policy or policies of insurance shall provide at least ten days advance notice to Lessor in writing of cancellation or change or modification in any terms, conditions or amounts of coverage provided herein. Lessor shall be provided with a true copy or certificate of such insurance. Should Lessee fail to produce or pay the cost of maintaining in force the insurance specified herein or to provide Lessor with a copy or certificate of such insurance, Lessor may, but shall not be obligated to, procure such insurance and Lessee shall reimburse Lessor on demand for the cost thereof. Suffering lapse or cancellation of the required insurance shall be an immediate and automatic default by Lessee hereunder.
- 5. INDEMNITY Lessee agrees to indemnify and hold Lessor free and harmless from any liability, loss, cost, damage, expense, including attorney's fees, which Lessor may suffer or incur as a result of any claims which may be made by any person or persons, including but not limited to Lessee, its agents and employees, that arise out of or result from the manufacture, delivery, actual or alleged ownership, performance, use, operation, selection, leasing and/or return of the vehicles, whether such claims are based on negligence, whether of Lessor or another, breach of contract, breach of warranty, absolute liability or otherwise.
- 6. TITLE This instrument is a lease and not an installment contract. The vehicles are the sole property of the Lessor and Lessee shall insure that Lessor is named as owner on any certificate of title issued with respect to the vehicles. Lessee shall have no right, title, or interest in or to the vehicles except for the right to operate and use the vehicles for the purposes stated herein and not as the agent of Lessor, so long as Lessee is not in default under the terms of this lease.
- 7. USE BY LESSEE Lessee agrees to use the vehicles only for lawful purposes. Lessee agrees not to assign, transfer or sublet its rights or otherwise encumber its interest hereunder. In the event Lessee fails to pay

any assessment, tax, lien or fine levied against the vehicles, Lessor may, at its election, make such payment and Lessee shall reimburse Lessor on demand. Lessee shall indemnify and hold Lessor harmless from any and all fines, forfeiture, damages, or penalties resulting from violations of any law, ordinance, rule, or regulation.

- 8. MAINTENANCE Lessee shall keep and maintain the vehicles in good operating condition and working order as required in the maintenance program described in the Owner's Manual and shall perform all protective maintenance required to insure full validation of the manufacturer's warranty. Such maintenance hereinbefore described shall be made at the Lessee's expense.
- 9. LICENSE, TAXES, AND OTHER EXPENSES Lessee agrees to pay all costs, expenses, fees and charges incurred in connection with the licensing and registration of said vehicles, of title thereto and in connection with the use and operation thereof during the term of this lease, including without limitation, gasoline, oil, lubrication, repairs, maintenance, tires, storage, parking, tools, fines, towing, servicing costs, as well as all sales taxes, use taxes, personal property and other ad valorem taxes and all assessments and other governmental charges whatsoever and by whomsoever payable on the said vehicles or on the use, ownership, possession, rental, shipment, transportation, delivery or operation of same. Lessor shall in no way be obligated to maintain, repair or service said vehicles.
- 10. TERMINATION This lease agreement may be terminated by the Lessor in the event one or more of the terms of this lease agreement is breached by the Lessee or the Lessee is in default as provided in the lease agreement. Upon the discovery of the breach or default, as the case may be, the Lessee shall surrender the vehicles to the Lessor on demand. Lessee shall remain liable and responsible for any pending claims, maintenance, repairs, taxes, licenses, and any other expenses associated with Lessee's use of the vehicles.
- 11. DEFAULT In the event that the Lessee does not pay any charge, expense, or cost herein agreed to be paid by Lessee when due, or fails to obtain or maintain any insurance required by this Lease, or violates or fails to perform or otherwise breaches any undertaking or covenants contained in this Lease, or any other Lease or Lessor, or becomes insolvent or makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or files a voluntary petition in bankruptcy, or if any voluntary petition in bankruptcy is filed against the Lessee, or other proceeding for the appointment of a receiver for Lessee is filed, or if proceedings for reorganization, extension and/for composition with creditors under any provision or federal law be instituted by or against Lessee, or if the property of Lessee be levied upon or if Lessor should otherwise deem itself or the vehicles unsafe or unsecured or should Lessor in good faith believe that the prospect of payment of rental or other payment or other performance by Lessee is impaired, then and in any such event, the Lessee shall be deemed in default of this Lease. Upon the occurrence of any such default, Lessor may, at its option and without notice or demand, declare this agreement in default and thereupon the vehicles and all rights of Lessee therein shall be surrendered to Lessor and Lessor may take possession of the vehicles wherever found, with or without process of law, and for this purpose may enter upon any premises of Lessee or wherever the same be found, without liability therefore. The Lessor may retain all rentals and payment and resale proceeds theretofore received and other sums, if any, otherwise payable to the Lessee hereunder and the Lessor shall be entitled to recover from Lessee

any unpaid charges for the balance of the lease term for the vehicles and all other sums, if any, due to come due, together with all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, incurred by Lessor in the enforcement of its rights and remedies hereunder. The repossession and sale of the vehicles by Lessor shall not affect Lessor's right to recover from Lessee all damages which Lessor may have suffered by reason of Lessee's breach of any provision of this Lease and Lessor may sell any such vehicles with or without advertisement, at public or private sale and without notice thereof to Lessee. The rights and remedies of Lessor in the event of default herein mentioned shall not be deemed exclusive but shall be cumulative and in addition to all other rights and remedies in Lessor's favor existing by law.

- 12. APPLICABLE LAW This Lease has been executed by the Lessee and delivered to the Lessor at the Lessor's offices in Kankakee, Illinois, and it shall be governed by and interpreted under the laws of Illinois.
- 13. LOCATION The vehicles shall be principally kept or garaged when not in use at the Lessee's garage address in Kankakee County or at such other address in the State of Illinois as the Lessee shall give Lessor written notice of. The vehicles shall not be removed from the State of Illinois, except for trips of short duration, without the prior written consent of Lessor.
- 14. MISCELLANEOUS This instrument constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and shall be binding upon the parties and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors or assigns and shall only be amended by a written instrument signed by the parties hereto. Any waiver of the performance of any of the terms, covenants or conditions hereof by either party shall not be construed as thereafter waiving any such terms, condition or covenants, but the same shall remain in full force and effect, as if no such waiver had occurred.
- 15. SEVERABILITY This agreement is severable, and the invalidity, or unenforceability, of any provision of this Agreement, or any party hereof, shall not render the remainder of this Agreement invalid or enforceable.
- 16. This agreement may be amended by the mutual written consent of both parties.
